COMPANY MUSTER, FORT MARTIN SCOTT: AUGUST 15-16

The Texas Rifles will hold their summer muster at Fort Martin Scott on August 15 & 16. For those who have never been there, the fort is located near Fredericksburg. If you are coming from Austin, take U.S. 290 west. (It looks about 75 miles out of Austin on my map.) If you are coming from San Antonio, then take Interstate 10 north to Comfort (about 55 miles) where you will exit and then travel north (about another 22 miles) to Fredericksburg. You might want to consult your own map before leaving. Marvin Schroeder, who helps coordinate events for the park, tells me that the fort is actually located 2 miles east of the town on U.S. 290 about a quarter mile from Wal-Mart. The fort will be open Friday night to receive us.

We will be portraying troops in garrison stationed there to protect the area from Indians and Unionists. Limit the amount of furniture that you bring to what would be appropriate and leave all ice chests in your vehicles. We have several buildings open to us for our use during the day but we will camp on the parade ground. The fort is providing water and firewood. Because we are in garrison, we will run a company mess this time-approximately \$10-12 per man.

Uniform for the event will be overshirts. Bring your muskets, but as we are frontier troops, side knifes and pistols are appropriate. It is going to be hot so bring things you can do in the shade to entertain each other and the visitors. (Books, newspaper, writing material, musical instruments, cards, dice etc.) Although we will use the event as a time to get together and plan for the rest of the year, we will maintain our historical impression during the hours that the fort is open to visitors.

ARTICLES FROM THE MEMBERSHIP

HEADQUARTERS SEVENTH REGIMENT OF U.S. INFANTRY

Dear Fellow Texas Rifles:

I'd like to take this time to invite you to our Mexican War event at Ft. Scott, Kansas on September 11-13. The site is a fully restored 1842 Frontier Army Post. There are many enjoyable scenarios planned, and all meals (except on Friday), as well as modern restroom facilities will be provided.

As a big enticement for you we are planning a bus trip to the Fort. The bus will leave from Austin, Texas on Thursday evening, September 10, at 9 p.m. It will also stop in Waco and Dallas. The cost will be no more than \$55.00. We are working on obtaining several grants of money to help lower the cost, but if these do not come through the cost will be \$55.00. You'll be able to sleep on the bus, and not worry about driving that long distance yourself. The bus will leave Ft. Scott at either 2:00 or 2:30 p.m. on Sunday. We are asking that you limit your equipment. No four poster beds and dining room tents, maybe a few camp stools, musket and accourrements, and a garment bag with uniform, and perhaps a change of clothing. You may also want to bring a pillow for sleeping on the bus.

We should arrive at Ft. Scott early Friday morning. We will set up camp, let you stretch out and relax, see the Fort, perhaps do a little shopping downtown, and then in the afternoon begin a drill session to prepare for what will occur on Saturday. We will be on our own for Friday's meals.

Another enticement for you is our dress ball on Saturday night. If you had a great time at the previous Rifles' Balls, then you will enjoy this as well. Norman Hughes, the best instructor around, will leading the dancing. There will be two bands: Norman's 4th Artillery Band and the 1st Kansas Brass Band. The ball is held on the 2nd floor of the Infantry Barracks. The ladies will decorate for the ball, and if you become too warn inside you can step out onto the long veranda to smoke a cigar and cool down.

Special activities over the weekend will include a Ladies Literary Society Meeting; Ladies Rally to raise money for widows and orphans; all the duties and ceremonies of Garrison life; a small tactical demonstration on Saturday; inspection and muster on Sunday, culminating in a game of "Rounders" between the 7th U.S. and the Dragoons. You'll be able to spread blankets under the trees on the parade ground, and with your lady or bunkie eat strawberries and drink lemonade and watch the new game which is sweeping across the country. We will be using the 1845 Rules.

Now that you are all enthused, perhaps you are worried you can't go because you don't have equipment to portray a U.S. Regular. Fear not! We are trying to raise a company of volunteer troops. The Volunteers will be under the command of the Rifles' Captain Bruce Winders. Many of you have the following items already, and if you don't, Captain Winders and I will make them available to you at a very moderate price. We are looking for the following impression:

- 1. White cotton trousers
- 2. Period shirt with either cravat or stock
- 3. Brogans
- 4. Red pullover over shirt
- 5. 1839 style forage caps
- 6. White cross belts, or waist belt
- 7. C. W. cartridge box with forty blank rounds
- 8. Wooden, tin, or gourd canteen
- 9. Flintlock or early percussion musket (no Enfields or post war Springfields)
- 10. Knapsack or blanket roll

Bruce has agreed to make the forage caps, and I will make the red flannel overshirts. These will not be like the Wilson Creek shirts; they will last more than one weekend, and they make excellent night shirts! White Cotton Fall front trousers, if you need a pair, are available from Gohn Bros., Box 111, 105 South Main, Middlebury, IN, 46540. Catalogue # is #44 Natural Broadfalls. The price is \$17.98 per pair. You can call and order - the phone number is 219-825-2400. Correct buttons are available from Stephen Osman, 5424 Elliot Ave., S, Minneapolis, MN 55417. The catalogue # is R 11. The cost is \$.20 each.

DRILL BITS: WHEELS AND TURNS By Jamie Bain

Wheels and turns are two maneuvers where the direction and/or formation of the company changes rapidly. During these movements, it is vital that everyone in the company understand what the expected outcome of the maneuver is, and how to achieve it in the quickest and most orderly manner.

Here's a simple rule that will work in any maneuver to get it done quickly, and help the entire company keep its alignment. When the company begins a maneuver, understand where the company starts, and where it should end up. After that, just concentrate on where <u>you</u> have to go. You can usually do that by concentrating on a <u>single person</u>, rather than the <u>entire company</u>.

The Wheel and the Turn are rather similar in that both maneuvers are intended to take a company in line and change its direction of march by 90 degrees. Of course, the actual change in direction could be greater or lesser than 90 degrees; but as a general rule of thumb it should be assumed to be 90 degrees.

During a wheel, don't try to see all the way to end of the line, just stay right with the man next to you. When people start leaning out to see the entire line, the line ends up bowing outward. Be aware of where the guide is. Also, staying with the guide means touch to that side, not push to that side.

Turns seem a little harder to do because the company alignment is not maintained during the movement. Try to keep in mind that a turn is simply a 45 degree turn, a few steps, another 45 degree turn, and then a few more steps. Everyone in the company makes the first 45 degree turn together (so the company is actually marching at the oblique). The second 45 degree turn is made individually. You don't need to know how far from the end of company you stand, to know how many steps you take before making that second turn. Just remember that when the man next to you turns, you take one more step, then turn yourself. As each person makes that second turn, he then comes up on the new company line of march, and company alignment is restored.

By understanding the whole picture, but only focusing on your small part of it, complicated movements suddenly become simple.

REPORT ON THE NEW BRAUNFELS MUSTER

The site chosen was perfect for drill and a good deal of drilling was in fact done. The platoon went over company drill (wheeling, countermarching, oblique marching, by company into line, moving by the left and right flanks, going on the right by file into line, breaking files to march to the rear as well as to the front), the manual of arms, stacking and firings as well as skirmish drill; we even did a skirmish line wheel! Another thing that was done over the weekend was to practice our step to make sure we were keeping the right pace during common, quick and double-quick time. Happily we discovered that we were only one or two steps off the times mandated by Hardee's ---big congrats to Chris Strzelecki who counted cadence during our drill!

In addition to the above the Austin/San Antonio Region also built a brush arbor to provide some shade. This was hard work, but fun and well worth the effort; Dan Morgan brought his period camera out and took some good photos. Everyone got to watch Seguin's fireworks display on Saturday night as well as enjoy watermelon, fried chicken, singing, games of chance and good old fashion talking. Another enjoyable incident was when the men taught Kay Kuykendall, Valerie Haesly and Ingrid Stout how to fire a musket. The girls did quite well (although their volley was a little ragged) and we can now leave our camp in their charge secure in the knowledge that they can defend it.

Speaking of defending the camp, on Saturday afternoon Phil Ulbrich led a traitorous squad in a surprise attack on the camp. This act of aggression was soon put down, but Sergeant Ulbrich's platoon did manage to win a spirited skirmish later that day.

On Sunday the troops made a one and 3/4 mile route march, practicing skirmish drill, forming the company into two and then one rank along the way as well as breaking into platoons. This was good practice for Perryville and the Red River campaign and something we all decided we needed to do more of, given the



I'd like to give special thanks to Phil Ulbrich for all of the hard work he did in keeping us supplied with water and other necessities and to his parents for the use of this ideal site for a muster. I would also like to thank Michelle Cleveland and Cansis Ulbrich for their kind efforts to bring us fried chicken and doughnuts during the weekend. The drill at this event was the best and smoothest I have ever seen conducted at a Texas Rifles muster and I was very proud of everyone who came out and participated. Hopefully we can plan a fall or early spring muster and make use of this excellent site again.
